CITIZEN PARTICIPATION:

Bucks County Recorder of Deeds Robin Robinson and Deputy Recorder of Deeds Steve Pizzolo gave a PowerPoint presentation on the Recorder of Deeds' efforts to preserve the old deeds and other historical documents in the County's possession some of which date back to the 1600's. They are using the talents of a company in Essex, Vermont called Kofile Technology to restore and re-bind the books. The effort is expensive and Ms. Robinson is soliciting funds through a project they have named "Adopt a Book" to assist in paying for the book restoration.

Barry Kuhn, 121 W. Church Street thanked the Council for the Appreciation Dinner. He further thanked Council for removing the junk at 216 Washington Avenue. He further suggested that the one-way designation on Old Main Street be installed ahead of the bridge closure.

Tiki Martino, Chair Revitalization Committee stated that the Community Cleanup Day is scheduled for Saturday, May 4th. The volunteers will assemble at the American Legion at 9:00 a.m.
