A motion was made by Mr. Crouthamel that the Consent Calendar, Items (A) through (I), be approved as presented. Ms. Saylor seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

CITIZEN PARTICIPATION:

Mr. Gary Gorman, 505 Washington Avenue addressed the Council regarding flooding that occurred on Washington Avenue and Eyre Avenue on August 4, 2020. There is a storm sewer pipe that runs parallel to Eyre Avenue and down to Eyre that needs to be replaced and is on a borough owned easement. He also stated that chunks of asphalt and a stone pile have washed into the drainage ditch that in on his property. Manager Rivet stated that he is aware of the drainage pipe problem on Eyre Avenue and the borough engineers are working on a replacement plan. He also said he would investigate the asphalt pieces in the drainage ditch.

NEW BUSINESS:

A. Ordinances

Ordinance No. 733- an ordinance extending the LERTA designation for the Sellersville Business Campus was moved for adoption by Mr. Hull. Motion was seconded by Mr. Crouthamel and passed with all in favor.

B. Resolutions

Resolution 20-11- a resolution to approve a master casting agreement with the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PA DOT) which allows the borough to reimburse PA DOT for any utility manhole cover work or replacements done by them or their contractors on PA DOT projects, was moved for approval by Mr. Hull. Motion was seconded by Ms. Saylor and passed with all in favor.

D. Authorizations

Manager Rivet informed the Council that the West Rockhill-Sellersville Joint Recreation Authority, which runs the Holiday House Recreation Center has run out of funds to pay its bills for the rest of the year. Additionally, there are repairs that need to be performed prior to re-opening next season. He estimated that both the Borough and Township of West Rockhill would have to contribute approximately \$19,000 to get the Joint Recreation Authority through the year. The Holiday House Recreation Center closure due to COVID-19 exasperated the Authority's already difficult financial situation. Council members questioned whether or not West Rockhill Township will equally contribute. Manager Rivet stated that he cannot answer for the township supervisor's however, the borough is the fiduciary agent and there are bills that need to be paid. He further opined that if the Township will not be an equal partner, there may have to be future discussions with the town moving forward. After further discussion, Mr. Crouthamel moved to increase the support to the West Rockhill-Sellersville Joint Recreation Authority for 2020, by an additional \$19,000. Motion was seconded by Mrs. Hallman and passed with all in favor.

OTHER BUSINESS

Police Chief Robert Schurr stated that the fire department and borough employees did a great job assisting during the flood. The police department received 154 calls during the event. Evacuations had to be performed at 65 N. Main Street.

Ms. Saylor noted that in reading the fire department's monthly reports that a 54% of calls are in the Town of West Rockhill. Mr. Hull stated that West Rockhill Township is served by several surrounding fire departments and they should all get together and go to the town requesting additional financial support. Ms. Saylor stated that the fire department needs to organize a united front of the servicing fire departments and approach the town for more money especially in light of the borough instituting a 3 mill fire tax.

Mayor Hufnagle requested that the Manager suggest to the railroad operator to check the track condition near the old steel mill for damage following the August 4th flood.
